Learning in school:

Topic: Let's explore our planet

This half term we will learning about our planet. We will be looking at our local environment, and then comparing, and contrasting our local environment with other countries.

Continuing our work on our topic book 'Lost and Found' we will be learning facts all about penguins. We will be watching fact videos all about penguins to learn some facts. We will then be working on verbally constructing sentences to record video clips for nursery to teach them all about penguins. In science and DT, we will be investigating boats; talking about the materials used to make them and how many people they can carry.

Phonics:

This week in Phonics, we will be focusing on reading and writing words ending in 's' and 'es' and longer words.

Maths:

Carrying on from our topic work last week, in Maths, we are learning to create maps. We will create maps of journeys we have been on and will also be creating a map of the journey Little Red Riding Hood goes on. The children will also be learning to create a map of our classrooms.

Additional notes and reminders

Homework- We are continuing with writing this half term.

Your child will be coming home with a new workbook. Just a reminder that the workbook is for the whole half term and the dates are shown on each page. This should be completed on a weekly basis and not all at once.

Get your child to first orally tell you a sentence about the picture and then get them to write it down. Remind your child to use their capital letters, finger spaces and full stops and please encourage them to sound out phonetically plausible words rather than giving them the spelling.
