Learning in school:

Theme for the Term: Dangerous Dinosaurs!

We are going back in time to widen our knowledge about dinosaurs. We will be looking at the similarities and differences between the dinosaurs, their size and features. We will also be learning facts using non-fiction books and learning how to look after dinosaurs.

Theme for the Week: Harry and the bucketful of dinosaurs

As we gear up for another week of learning and exploration, we have some thrilling news to share! Brace yourselves, because the **missing dinosaurs are making a comeback! (Shhh, don't tell the children)** Starting next week, our little explorers will embark on an adventure. The children will be reunited with their favourite ancient reptiles, and together, they'll set off on a journey around our school grounds.

Phonics:

This week we will be recapping the digraphs and trigraphs we have learned previously (ai, ee, igh, oa, oo, oo, ar, or, ur, ow and oi) and learning the new trigraph 'air' and the digraph 'er' and will also be learning to read words with double letters.

Maths:

In our math sessions, we'll continue our exploration of the numbers **6, 7, and 8**. We'll continue to look at counting, patterns, and will investigate some simple addition.
