Learning in school:

Theme for the Term: Dangerous Dinosaurs!

We are going back in time to widen our knowledge about dinosaurs. We will be looking at the similarities and differences between the dinosaurs, their size and features. We will also be learning facts using non-fiction books and learning how to look after dinosaurs.

Theme for the Week: Harry and the bucketful of dinosaurs

In our language sessions, the children will be learning to orally compose a sentence using the who, doing what, and what as prompts for their sentence structure. Each child will spin a simple sentence about their dinosaur's epic escapades which we will then write down on postcards! We will be focusing on letter formation, sounding out and writing down all the words in our sentences.

Phonics:

This week we will be recapping the digraphs and trigraphs we have learned previously and will be learning to read longer words.

Maths:

In math, we're continuing our learning about doubles and will also be learning about odds and evens.
