What will I know by the end of Year 1?

- Queen Victoria was born in 1819 and died in 1901.
- She became queen in 1837, when she was only 18.
- Queen Victoria's reign of almost 64 years was the longest in British history until she was beaten by Queen Elizabeth II.
- The time when Queen Victoria ruled is known as The Victorian Era.
- Britain was the world's most powerful country during the Victorian Era. It ruled over many other countries around the world. Together, Britain and all the countries that Britain ruled were known as the British Empire.
- Queen Victoria helped to keep peace in Europe, for example she wrote a letter to help stop a war starting between Germany and France.
- Britain changed a lot while Victoria was queen. The Industrial Revolution meant that towns and cities became bigger, busier and more polluted.
- Many Victorians were very poor and lived in crowded houses without enough food or health care and many children worked instead of going to school.
- Queen Victoria didn't have any brothers or sisters, but she had 9 children of her own with her husband, Prince Albert.
- After Prince Albert died, Queen Victoria was very sad for a long time and was not seen in public.
