Maths	

Learning in school:

This week we will be learning to measure using a standard unit of measurement. We will be measuring using rulers and seeing how long or tall objects in our classroom are. We will be measuring using centimetres and recording our measurements. We will be comparing the lengths of objects and adding the lengths of 2 objects together. The children will be writing cms to show how many centimetres each of the items are. Finally the children will be estimating the length of a variety of objects.

Can your child practise using a cm ruler to measure some objects in and around your home. Please help them to line the ruler up carefully along the side of the object. So that the measurement is correct. Can they write down the measurements, which item is the longest?, which is the shortest? Which item is the middle length?

Following on from this, can your child practise drawing some straight lines of different lengths.

English

Learning in school:

This week we will read the rest of the book 'What We'll Build' by Oliver Jeffers. We will begin by looking in more detail at the page that reads 'We'll put these favourite things beside the earlier love we set aside.' We will then discuss the objects that are most important to us and why. We will also be exploring in more detail what building a future means and the children will be encouraged to make their own wish for the future.

As we have now read several Oliver Jeffers books we will be discussing the similarities and differences between them and talking about our favourites. The children will then choose their favourite Oliver Jeffers book to write a book review.

In English/PSHE we will be thinking about what makes us special and identifying what special qualities our friends in the class have.

Reading

We will be hearing the children read as normal this week and they can continue to change their books on a Monday or Thursday as well as their reading day. Please keep your child's reading book and reading record book in their bookbag each day as your child may now have a new reading day.

Activity 2

After listening to the stories, talk to your child about what happened in the story and what they liked or disliked. Who were the characters in the story? Do they notice any things that are the same or different in the Oliver Jeffers stories.

Phonics

Learning in school:

We will be continuing to work on Phase 5, thinking about alternative graphemes for sounds that we have already come across. This week we will be learning about the alternative sounds that the letters 'ou' can make. For example in the words, cloud, soup, could and shoulder. We will be reading words with these digraphs and segmenting them out loud, thinking about the number of sounds in each word and then trying to write them. We will then be reading and writing sentences using these sounds.
