Maybe you could make a model house, car, tower or castle. Talk to an adult about the different 3d shapes you have used. Which shapes are easier to build with? Is it stable or unstable? How do you know? You could take a photo or draw and label your model once you have finished it.</p>

Extension: Then your child can chose a further challenge:

- *How many pennies can your tin foil boat hold before it sinks? **(Instructions and a design sheet have been uploaded to the Google Drive)**
- * Can you make a boat out of the skin of a fruit? Eg orange, lemon, lime or avocado perhaps! Compare a few, which one's best and why?
- * Can you make your boat move across water, without touching it? what could you use to help?- A fan? Is a boat with a sail easier or harder to move? Why do you think that?
