Maths

Learning in school:

During this week in maths the children will be revising that addition is the inverse of subtraction and using this knowledge to find missing numbers and to check calculations.

English

Learning in school:

This week, we will be reading the beginning of *The Tunnel* by Anthony Browne, up until the point that the children (Jack and Rose) enter the tunnel. Children will then think about what imaginary world might be at the other end of the tunnel. They will first draw and label what they might see, hear, smell and how they might feel there. Children will then go on to write a description of their imaginary world in the present tense using noun phrases and conjunctions.
