Learning in school:

In maths this week, we will be learning what doubling means and how to double numbers. We will be teaching the children that double means same again and two lots. We will be using careful counting to double our numbers and seeing if we can remember all the doubles of numbers 1 to 10. For example 1+1=2, 2+2=4. 3+3=6 and so on. We will also look at the doubles of numbers above 10, to see if the children can see the patterns in the sequence of the numbers. The children will be showing the doubles of numbers as calculations. For example 5+5=10 and 7+7=14

English

Learning in school:

In English this week, we will be planning and writing our own magic potion story. We will be thinking about the work we have done on Alice in Wonderland so far to help us write our own version of the story. The children will also use what they have learned in previous weeks about story settings, and using adjectives and conjunctions to add more detail to their writing. We will be planning and writing our story in three parts - beginning, middle and end.

Reading

We will be hearing the children read as normal this week and they can continue to change their books on a Monday or Thursday as well as their reading day.

Please remember your child can still read books from the Rising Stars online reading scheme.

Home Learning (if your child is self-isolating):

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Activity

Can your child have a go at writing their own magic potion story.

Please talk to your child about how stories have three parts, a beginning, middle and an end.

Discuss what happens in the three parts of a story.

Beginning - setting the scene, describing the setting, introducing the characters.

Middle - when a problem occurs, the part of the story that makes us say 'Oh no!'

End - resolving the problem and finishing the story with a happy ending.

Here are some questions for your child to think about.

Where were you? What were you doing?

Who did you follow? Where did you follow them?

What did you see? What did you hear? What did you smell?

Where did you find the magic potion?

What happened when you drank it? (Problem)

How did you solve the problem?

What did you try first, then, next, finally?

Phonics

Learning in school:

We will be continuing to work on Phase 5, thinking about alternative graphemes for sounds that we have already come across. This week we will be revising some alternative sounds we have looked at previously as well as learning about some new alternative sounds. We will be looking at the letter 'a' making an 'ar' sound as in branch, past, after, the letters 'al' making an 'ar' sound as in half, calm, palm, the letters 'or' making an 'ur' sound as in word, world, work and finally the letters 'ear' making an 'ur' sound as in learn, early, pearl.

We will be reading words with these sounds and segmenting them out loud, thinking about the number of sounds in each word and then trying to write them. We will then be reading and writing sentences using these sounds.

Topic

Learning in school:

In History we will continue learning about life in Victorian times. We will be learning about how life was different for the rich and the poor, in particular for the children. In RE we will be learning about the Jewish Sabbath - Shabbat. In PSHE we will be learning about what to do when we fall out with someone else. We will revisit "What would Roo do?" and find strategies to help in these situations. In computing we will continue to work on our animated stories and will be learning how to animate just one character on a page.

We will also focus on the fact that this week is "Mental Health Awareness Week 2021". The theme this year is Nature. Your child will be creating a cress head to watch grow at home over the week. We will also be looking carefully at items from the natural world, in order to see the beauty in it, and to notice the things that we often take for granted.

This week in Music, we will be thinking about beat and rhythm and following them in a song. We will also use different body percussion and instruments to play each part.

Home Learning (if your child is self-isolating):

Music

Please watch the video clip below of Twinkle Twinkle Little Star. Ask your child to find the steady beat and clap it or tap it on their knees.

Think about the rhythm. How is it different? It follows the words in the song. We have to clap out the syllables in each word in time to the song. i.e. twink -le, twink -le, litt-le, star, how I won-der, what you are

If they can do this easily and correctly in time, then they could have a go at listening to each verse, and switch between the beat for verse one, beat for verse two etc.
