Learning in school:

This week we will be continuing to look at measure. We will begin the week by learning about mass and looking at how we can find out how heavy or light an object is. We will be learning how to use balance scales and will compare the mass of different objects. The vocabulary that we will be using is heavy, heavier, heavier than, light, lighter, lighter than, the same and balance.

The second half of the week we will be looking at time. We will be reading and making o'clock and half past times on an analogue clock. We will be learning about the different hands on the clock and then drawing them to show o'clock and half past times.

Then can they have a go at making a given o'clock or half past time on the clock. Please encourage your child to think carefully about where the minute and hour hands are pointing. English

Learning in school:

This week we will complete some final activities linked to "The Way Back Home". We will be writing a conversation between the boy and the alien, using the walkie talkies that arrived in the post for the boy.

We will be looking at the use of suffixes in words to check how and when we use them. We will also be punctuating some writing about the story. We will be using capital letters for the beginning of sentences and names, full stops, question marks and exclamation marks.

Reading

We will be hearing the children read as normal this week and they can continue to change their books on a Monday or Thursday as well as their reading day. Please keep your child's reading book and reading record book in their bookbag each day as your child may now have a new reading day.

Please remember your child can still read books from the Rising Stars online reading scheme.

Activity 1

Ask your child to think about the story of "The Way back Home". Here is a link to the story if they have forgotten it:

Ask your child about how the story ended. What was the gift and who sent it? Why did they send it? When the boy and the alien use the walkie talkies, what might they say to each other? Ask your child to draw the boy and the alien. They can then have a go at writing some sentences that they each say. Try not to use a speech bubble even though your child may want to, as it restricts the amount that they can write. They could write the boy's speech in one colour and the alien's in pencil if they prefer.

Activity 2

Please talk to your child about the suffixes that they have covered this year so far: - er, -est, -ed and -ing. When might we use each of them? -er is a comparative - it compares one thing to another e.g. shorter, -est is a superlative, it is the most of something, e.g. ,shortest. We often talk about superlatives as being like superman - the strongest man etc.

-ing is used as a suffix to a verb to indicate the action. Whether the action is in the past present or future depends on the word before it i.e. was/or were walking, is walking or will be walking. The suffix -ed puts regular verbs into the past for example walked.

Please ask your child to draw:

A short alien and then add -er to short to make a new word and draw the picture (i.e. they will draw a shorter alien, then add -est to make a new word and draw the shortest alien.)

Repeat with:

tall

sweet

fat

thin smart

Activity 3

Remind your child about the -ed suffix and what it does to the root word (puts it into the past tense).

Your child can then practise writing sentences changing the following sentences into the past by using the -ed suffix. (If your child finds this easy then please encourage them to add further detail by adding adjectives and extending the sentence by adding a conjunction as well please (and, but, because, so that)

- I jump in the puddles.
- I walk to the shops.
- I need to buy a new top.
- I want to go to the park.
- I turn into my road.

Phonics

Learning in school:

We will be continuing to work on Phase 5, thinking about alternative graphemes for sounds that we have already come across. This week we will be learning about the alternative sounds that the letters 'e" and "ey" can make. For example in the words, decent, recent, she, be, me and grey, they, obey, prey. We will be reading words with these single phonemes and digraphs and segmenting them out loud, thinking about the number of sounds in each word and then trying to write them. We will then be reading and writing sentences using these sounds.

Topic

Learning in school:

This week we will be thinking about ways to exercise and how we feel when we are doing different activities. We will be trying a range of challenges and seeing how many we can do in a minute. In Art we will be creating our own aliens, adding different things to make our aliens look unique. In RE we will be reading the story of "Feeding The 5000" and learning about how Jesus helped people believe that God cared for them all. In our history we will be learning about the Space Race between the USA and Russia. The children will have the opportunity to

watch some actual footage of the rockets going into space. They will also be learning about the astronaut Neil Armstrong.
