Learning in school:

## Theme for the Term: Traditional Tales with a Twist!

We will be continuing our learning about different story characters and themes. This topic's focus will be on well-loved traditional tales. But we will be exploring these stories from a different view point! Through drama and story retelling we will be developing the children's knowledge of story language and the structure of a story. Once secure with these stories we will then be drawing story maps and having a go at creating our own versions.

## Theme for the Week: What big eyes you have!

We will be continuing our work on the text 'Little Red: A Howlingly Good Fairy Tale with a Twist' by Lynn Roberts. This week we will come across the Wolf's diary! We will read a few entries and collect a list of features of diary writing. We will then have a go at writing our own creative entry- the sillier the better!

The next part of our binka blanket design will require the children to learn and practise straight stitch/running stitch.

We will be continuing with the NSPCC's 'Speak out, Stay Safe' campaign. This is where we will be reminding the children about private parts and kind/unkind behaviour and how this links to bullying. We will be teaching children the definition of bullying - constant unkind behaviour. We will also be teaching the children about who they can talk to as part of the Speak out, Stay Safe campaign.

#### Phonics:

This week we will be focusing on words with two or more digraphs in them. We will be continuing to orally blend, read sentences, practise writing and reading tricky words.

### Maths:

This week we will be learning about number bonds to 10. We will be using different practical resources to find pairs of numbers that total 10 and we will be writing number calculations reflecting these.
