Learning in school:

Theme for the Term: Who will I meet in this book?

During this topic we will be exploring popular stories with a particular focus The Tiger who Came to Tea by Judith Kerr. We will be looking at different characters and themes. And, will be working on developing the children's knowledge of story language and the structure of a story.

Theme for the Week: Oh no! Who has come for tea?

Following on from our exploration of the text "The Tiger who Came to Tea." The children will be creating their own versions of an animal who came to tea at their house. We will be working on planning a story with a beginning, a middle and an end. We will firstly practise verbally telling our story and then will work on writing it down with a focus on sounding out and finger spaces.

Phonics:

This week we will be continuing to practise reading longer words by 'chunking' them. For example in the word 'laptop', we will 'chunk' it into 2 smaller parts (its syllables): l-a-p/t-o-p.

We will also be continuing to practise reading the tricky words: are, sure, pure, into, she, push, he, we, me, be, of.

Maths:

This week we will be learning all about number 8 and what other numbers we can find in 8.
