Library

From next week, we are going to let you help your child change their library books! This is a great chance for you and your child to have more conversations about the books they are reading.

This will take place after school in the places and at the times detailed below.

Theme for the Term: Terrific Tales. This half term we will get into some longer stories with some familiar characters. This week we will move onto The Three Little Pigs. Please, again, keep this a secret as there is going to be a situation that only a Big Bad Wolf is to blame...

Literacy

Our key text is 'The Three Little Pigs' this week. After a few days of problem solving and making houses out of straw, sticks and bricks, we will finally start reading the story. We will leave many opportunities to predict what might happen next and making our own versions up too.

Maths and Expressive Arts and Design

Two dimensional and three dimensional shapes will be explored this week. During our input we will see what happens when a 2D shape turns into a 3D shape when it is put into a 'magic bag'. We will use mathematical language such as side and face along with the shape names too. The language and investigation will continue when building houses for the three little pigs.

Music

In music this week we continue to sing our new song called 'Teddy Bear Teddy Bear' We will use musical instruments to help us recreate the sound of the teddy bear moving-jumping, sleeping, turning around, etc.

<u>Uniform</u>

The nursery children look very smart in their new school uniform.

<u>Lunch boxes</u>

Please remember that we are a nut free school so lunched must not include anything with nuts or that contain nuts at all. Please be careful to pack a lunchbox that is accessible for your child so that they can open packets themselves and that they are not over faced with too much food. Please cut grapes in half (long ways) so that they are safe for your child to eat without it being a choking hazard. Please remember to pack balanced, healthy lunch for your child.
