Learning in school:

Topic: Minibeasts and Growing

This next half term we will be learning about a variety of minibeasts. We will be looking at similarities and differences between them and where we find them.

This week, along with observing our caterpillars and our plants that we planted last week, we will be learning all about bees! The children were really interested in bees when we were learning all about flowers. We'll be looking at some information books to learn facts and will be introducing the children to the vocabulary hive, nectar, Queen bee and worker bee etc. We'll also have a special delivery from the bees so we can make our own honey sandwiches (shhhh, don't tell the kids!). If your child has any allergies then please speak to your child's class teacher.

We will ventilate the classrooms all day and spend as much time as possible outside, so please make sure your child has appropriate clothing/ sunscreen applied for sunny

days.
