Learning in school:

Topic: Minibeasts and Growing

This next half term we will be learning about a variety of minibeasts. We will be looking at similarities and differences between them and where we find them.

This week our theme for the week is 'What has been delivered?' We will have a special delivery (caterpillars). The children will help set up their home and will also be making observations on what they can see the caterpillars doing to tell other children and adults in the class. We will be learning facts about caterpillars and will be learning about their life cycle.

We will ventilate the classrooms all day and spend as much time as possible outside, so please make sure your child has appropriate clothing/sunscreen applied for sunny days.

Home learning (for children self-isolating):

- Can your child make their own picture of the different parts of the life cycle of a caterpillar- egg, caterpillar, chrysalis and butterfly
- Explore Mini Mash; you will find the topic pin 'Minibeasts' pinned to the homepage.

Phonics:

This week in school, we will be recapping the digraphs: ai, ee, igh and oa with a focus on spelling words with these sounds in.

Home learning (for children self-isolating):

Maths:

In maths, we will be recapping the vocabulary 'whole' and 'parts'. We will be linking this to number bonds of 10 e.g. 9 and 1 makes 10, 10 is the whole and 9 and 1 are the two parts.
