Learning in school

Suggested home learning for children selfisolating (to supplement isolation packs)

Maths

Learning in school:

In Maths we will be working on fractions and learning that to find half we share into two equal parts. We will be investigating how to make half practically and then finding half of shapes. We will learn how to write $\frac{1}{2}$ as a fraction and learn the vocabulary, vinculum, numerator and denominator.

We will then move on to halving numbers and we will be exploring if we can always halve a number and talking about odd and even numbers. The children will also be using the bar model to show how a number can be halved.

Learning in school:

In English this week, we will be beginning to pull together all our learning about the Victorian era, in order to make our own non-fiction books about the period. This week, we will sort facts into sections and we will then write about our first two areas – "Queen Victoria" and "Rich and Poor Families".

Reading

We will be hearing the children read as normal this week and they can continue to change their books on a Monday or Thursday as well as their reading day. Please remember your child can still read books from the Rising Stars online reading scheme.

Home Learning (if your child is self-isolating): PLEASE DO NOT ACCESS AND COMPLETE THESE UNLESS YOUR CHILD IS

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<u>Activity</u>

Can your child find a non-fiction book at home and discover the features? What might we need in a non-fiction book that we write? (Front cover, illustrations, text, labels, a contents page)

Your child could then have a go writing some facts about Queen Victoria, and rich and poor children. They will need to do each section on a new piece of paper, just like a section in a book. See if your child can answer these questions as they look at each section? <u>Queen Victoria</u> When was Queen Victoria born? How old was she when she became queen? Who did she marry? How many children did they have? What is the name that Queen Victoria is known as by many? (the grandmother of Europe) Why? What did Victoria do when Prince Albert died? When did Queen Victoria die?

Rich and Poor Families

What activities might you do if you were from a rich family? What toys might you have if you were rich, compared to if you were poor? Who would go to school? How did those that didn't go to school learn? What jobs might a poor Victorian child be expected to do? How often would children see their parents in a rich family? How often would they see them if they were from a poor family?

Phonics

Learning in school:

We will be continuing to work on Phase 5, thinking about alternative graphemes for sounds that we have already come across. This week we will be revising some alternative sounds we have looked at previously as well as learning about some new alternative sounds. We will be looking at the sound 'air" being made by the trigraph "ere" as in there, where and somewhere, the "air" sound being made by the trigraph "ear" as in pear, wear and bear, and finally the "air" sound being made by the trigraph "are" as in mare, hare and share. We will also look at the homgraph - "tear" and its different meanings.

We will be reading words with these sounds and segmenting them out loud, thinking about the number of sounds in each word and then trying to write them. We will then be reading and writing sentences using these sounds. We will also spot the different graphemes in a longer text.

Topic

Learning in school:

In science we will be focussing on how to measure accurately and observe closely, using simple equipment. We will use these observations to answer simple questions.

In art we will be looking at patchwork quilting which Victorian people used to display in their homes. We will be creating our own quilts, using pencils and crayons. We will take our pencil for a walk on our paper and then create a different coloured pattern in each section. We will also do some rubbings of different objects in and around our classroom to create different textures on our quilts. In PSHE we will be looking at cooperation and working together with our learning partners to make different tangram pictures. In computing we will continue to work on our animated stories and will be learning how to copy and paste a page and then edit it. In RE we will continue to learn about Judaism and will be looking at the different parts of a synagogue and what happens inside a synagogue.

Home Learning (if your child is self-isolating):

<u>Art</u>

Please give your child a large sheet of white paper A3 size. Get them to take their pencil for a walk across the whole sheet, creating wavy lines that touch each side of the paper. Once they have their lines on the paper they can colour or create different patterns in each section of the sheet. To create different textures can they do some rubbings of different objects, for some of the sections. When each section is finished, your child can use a dark coloured pen to draw stiches on all of the lines so as to resemble a quilt.
