Suggested home learning for children selfisolating (to supplement isolation packs)

Maths

Learning in school:

In Maths this week, we will be thinking about division. We will be looking at the division

symbol , the names of the different parts to it (numerator, vinculum and denominator) and the operation that we do when we have one in a calculation. We will then be practically sharing out objects fairly and equally to find answers to calculations. We will also begin to look at how we can solve worded problems using division or sharing, showing our working out with jottings.

English

Learning in school:

This week in school we will be using adjectives to describe a story setting. We will then be writing detailed descriptions of a river scene. Each of the pictures we will use will show a different season and we will describing what we can see, what we might hear, what we may smell and how we may feel if we were in this place. We will also be looking at using a variety of conjunctions to join our ideas together.

Reading

We will be hearing the children read as normal this week and they can continue to change their books on a Monday or Thursday as well as their reading day.

Please remember your child can still read books from the Rising Stars online reading scheme.

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<u>Activity</u>

Can you find a picture of a scene showing a river? Can your child then write some sentences to describe what they can see and what they may hear if they were sitting by the river in the picture. Can they also think about what they might smell or how they may be feeling if they were there.

Encourage your child to use adjectives and different conjunctions to join their ideas together.

For example "I can see the cool blue water rushing past the tall trees "

Phonics

Learning in school:

We will be continuing to work on Phase 5, thinking about alternative graphemes for sounds that we have already come across. This week we will be learning about the alternative sound and spelling for the "ear" trigraph. For example 'ere' as in here and severe and 'eer' as in cheer and sheer.

We will be reading words with these trigraphs and segmenting them out loud, thinking about the number of sounds in each word and then trying to write them. We will then be reading and writing sentences using these sounds.

Learning in school:

In Art we will continue looking at the Victorian artist Beatrix Potter. The children will be choosing one of her famous book characters to paint on their watercolour background. In History we will continue learning about life in Victorian times. We will be learning about schools, looking at the similarities and differences between school today, and in the past. In RE we will be learning about the Ten Commandments and how Moses was given these. We will then be writing them on our scrolls that we made last week. In PSHE we will be talking about friends and how we can be a good friend. This will include talking about how sometimes friends can fall out and thinking about what we could do to be an even better friend. In computing we will continue to work on our animated stories and will be learning how to add sound.
