Learning in school:

Theme for the Term: Who will I meet in this book?

During this topic we will be exploring popular stories with a particular focus The Tiger who Came to Tea by Judith Kerr. We will be looking at different characters and themes. And, will be working on developing the children's knowledge of story language and the structure of a story.

Theme for the Week: Kung Hei Fat Choi!

This week, we will be learning about Chinese and Korean New Year which are both celebrated on 1st Feb. We will learn the Chinese story of the animal race and find out about how families celebrate these special occasions. If your family celebrates either of these events, it would be fantastic if you could email (the class email address below) with some information about how it is celebrated in your family and if you have some photos that you are happy for the class to see, please attach them too. It is great to personalise the children's learning!

Phonics:

Sound sheets will continue to come home this term with the digraphs and trigraphs that we are learning. Please practise these with your children regularly so they become embedded. This will help their reading become more fluent. This week we will be practising reading longer words by 'chunking' them. For example in the word 'sunset', we will 'chunk' it into 2 smaller parts: s-u-n and s-e-t. We will be revisiting the tricky words: are, sure, pure, into, she, push, he, we, me, be, of.

Maths:

This week we will be learning all about number 7. We will be finding different ways of making 7 with cubes and practising writing number calculations to represent the ways we have found. We will also be working on our number formation.
