## Coming up next week...20/6/2022

Thank you so much for all of the lovely letters that have been written to friends in our partner school in Malawi.

Maths

Learning in school:

This week we will be learning the value of each digit in a 3-digit number and playing a game: 'Nice Vs Nasty'.

Nice: Children take turns in a pair to roll a 0-9 die. They choose whether to write the number that they have thrown in the hundreds, tens or ones column. They continue until their 3 digit number is complete and whomever makes the highest value number wins!

Nasty: After throwing the die, instead of choosing where to place the digit in their own hundreds, tens and ones grid, the children place the digit in their partner's! They will think about their tactics in order to get their partner to lose and them to win!

English/ Reading

Learning in school:

#### English:

On Friday we will be asking the children to write a recount about their trip to Hampton Court, including the full range of punctuation and with a focus on correct spelling. The rest of our English lessons will be cross-curricular with history this week.

In our SPAG/phonics lessons this week we will be dictating sentences to the children to see how well they can apply the spelling of common exception words in their writing (see homework.) Reading:

We will be reading individually with the children this week.

PSHE: This week, we will recap trip safety in preparation for our trip on Thursday. Because of the warm weather we will talk about Sun safety alongside this. We will also be talking about our favourite Mead memories in preparation for our Leavers' assembly at the end of term.

RE: This week, we will continue to learn about the fact that there are similarities and differences in the way people pray across different faiths.

History 1: Continuing our Henry VII learning, this lesson will have a particular focus on the different types of food that were enjoyed during Tudor times, compared with what people eat in the present day.

History 2: In preparation for our trip, children will look at pictures from Hampton Court Palace and guess what the rooms/areas pictured are and what they were used for. Children will imagine they are travelling back in time and using that area in Tudor times, acting out what would be happening. They will then freeze frame and discuss.

Art: Children will learn about the artist Frida Kahlo, focusing on her 1940 piece "Self-Portrait with Thorn Necklace and Hummingbird." We will discuss the artwork in the context of 'Watch me Grow', noting plants and animals in the background/ on her shoulders/ in her hair etc. The children will then draw themselves in the centre of their pages, using pencils at first. Like Frida, they will draw their favourite animals/pets on their shoulders. Next week we will use oil pastels to colour our self-portraits and torn tissue paper to create the foliage in the background.

Inside PE: We will continue our Invasion Games module, using a variety of skills to score goals.

Outside PE: We will continue our Athletics module, developing jumping for distance.

Music: Children will continue to 'Reflect, Rewind and Replay' and also begin to learn some songs for our Leavers' assembly.
