Coming up next week...09.05.22

Maths

In Maths this week, we will be learning what doubling means and how to double numbers. We will be teaching the children that double means same again and two lots. We will be using careful counting to double our numbers and seeing if we can remember all the doubles of numbers 1 to 10. For example 1+1=2, 2+2=4. 3+3=6 and so on. We will also look at the doubles of numbers above 10, to see if the children can see the patterns in the sequence of the numbers. The children will be showing the doubles of numbers as calculations. For example 5+5=10 and 7+7=14

English

In English this week, we will be planning and writing our own poems. We will be looking at the poem 'The Magic Box,' by Kit Wright and using it as a basis for our own.

Reading

This week we have really enjoyed listening to the story, 'Opposites Attract.' We have been thinking about the following key vocabulary:

force push pull magnet metal attract repel north pole south pole

Next week we will continue to think about this story and think about the characters and the plot. We will use our knowledge of the story to answer questions based on the text

Phonics

This week we will be thinking about:

In History we will continue learning about life in Victorian times. We will be learning about how life was different for the rich and the poor, in particular for the children. In RE we will be learning about the Jewish Sabbath - Shabbat.

In PSHE we will be learning about what to do when we fall out with someone else. We will revisit "What would Roo do?" and find strategies to help in these situations. In computing we will continue to work on our coding.

In Science we will be learning about the different parts of a plant and their functions. This week in Music, we will be thinking about beat and rhythm and following them in a song. We will also use different body percussion and instruments to play each part.

In PE we will continue to think about our learning through our athletics and fielding and striking units.
