On Tuesday 22.2.22 we will, as a school be celebrating 'Twosday'!

We will spend the day subitising two and finding lots of 'twos'

If the children would like to wear 'two' we'd love to see what they

could come up with- they could have a printed '2' on their jumper, two

gloves, two hair bands, two arm bands... let's go 'two' crazy!

What is subitising?

Subitising is when you are able to look at a group of objects and realise how many there are without counting. This only works with small groups of numbers, as we can only subitise up to 5 things.



Theme for the Term: Terrific Tales. This half term we will get into some longer stories with some familiar characters. The Gingerbread Man is the first of our stories. Please don't tell your children that this will be our story as they will come into Nursery with someone hiding in the oven...

Literacy

Our key text is 'The Gingerbread man' this week (again, this is top secret!)

Understanding the World

We will bake our own Gingerbread men this week. We will watch and discuss how the mixture changes when different ingredients are added and the again when they come out of the oven.

Reminders

Uniform

The nursery children look very smart in their new school uniform.

- Just a reminder this year we have introduced compulsory uniform. This
 consists of grey tracksuit bottoms or leggings and The Mead sweatshirt
 and white t-shirt. In summer children are able to wear grey or royal blue
 shorts.
- Skirts and dresses are not part of our school uniform as they can be dangerous when climbing.
- Please make sure that your child wears shoes safe to climbing- trainers or plimsolls are perfect (only Velcro please!)
- Please also remember no jewellery is allowed as part of our school uniform policy. This includes earrings.

Lunch boxes

Please remember that we are a nut free school so lunched must not include anything with nuts or that contain nuts at all. Please be careful to pack a lunchbox that is accessible for your child so that they can open packets themselves and that they are not over faced with too much food. Please cut grapes in half (long ways) so that they are safe for your child to eat without it being a choking hazard. Please remember to pack balanced, healthy lunch for your child.

Please can we also remind you to label everything including lunch boxes. Thank you
