Maths

Learning in school:

This week in maths we will be moving on to a new operation - multiplication. We begin by exploring counting objects in groups of 2, 3, 5 and 10. Then we progress to solving multiplication calculations using cubes and finally jottings (sticks and dots). We discuss with the children the importance of ensuring that the groups they are counting contain equal numbers of objects, cubes or jottings. There will be word problems as challenges including some greater depth word problems that contain more than one-step.

English

Learning in school:

This week we will be continuing our learning about the Great Fire of London by asking children what they already know about the fire and what they would like to find out. We will then share facts about the events. Next children will use pictures to sequence the different events and write statements to go with the pictures. We will also read and discuss the text 'Vlad and the Great Fire of London' as a class.

Reading:

We are returning to whole class shared reading using Bug Club. Our new Bug Club book is City Kids Detective Agency. We begin by discussing some key areas of prior knowledge and asking the children what they think the book might be about using the cover illustration. After reading the book, we progress to discussing and learning the new vocabulary in the book. The vocabulary in this book is linked to cities.

Learning in school:

We will be concentration on the spellings of Year 2 common exception words.

Phonics

Learning in school:

We will be focusing on the /e/ sound spelt 'ea', /ur/ sound spelt 'ir', /ow/ sound spelt 'ou' and the /oi/ sound spelt 'oy'. The children will be practising reading and writing words using these sounds. We will also continue to practise reading the tricky words - any, many, who, whole, two.

Topic

Learning in school:

Inside PE: The children will be learning to work with a partner to share and create ideas to perform.

Outside PE: Children will be learning to decide with a partner which route to take and to identify differences between jogging and sprinting.

Music: Along with playing musical games, each week the children 'listen and appraise' different pieces of music. This week we will be focusing on 'Bring Him Back Home' by Hugh Masekela. Children will explain why they like or dislike the song and talk about which instruments they can hear and what style of music it is. We will then continue to learn and perform Ho Ho Ho by Joanna Mangona.

History: Cross curricular link with English where children will be learning about the events of the Great Fire of London and how to sequence the events.

PSHE: This week is Anti-Bullying Week. Please send your child to school on Thursday wearing odd socks for Odd Socks Day. We will use our odd socks as a starting point to discuss and celebrate differences and how every person is unique. This year the Andy and the Odd Socks song is called One Kind Word. The children will listen to and discuss this song before creating their own 'chain of kindness'. Finally, later in the week we will discuss what bullying is and what a child should do if they think they are being bullied.

Art: This week the children will use stencils, paints and sponges to create a piece of art showing the London skyline.

Computing: Children will be copying, cutting and pasting to help make spreadsheets. Children will be using tools in a spreadsheet to automatically total rows and columns and use spreadsheets to solve a mathematical puzzle.

Maths - Subtraction

This week we have been looking at subtracting one number from another. We have been using a number line.

Remember we have been taking away the tens first and then the ones.
