Maths

Learning in school:

In maths, children will begin learning about money:

- > Mixed addition and subtraction questions
- > Compare number sentences
- > Solve missing number problems

English, Reading & Fluency

Learning in school:

In English, children will be consolidating their learning of poetry and creating their own independent poem using the techniques that they have learnt over the past few weeks. The children will be encouraged to 'paint with words'. Children will then edit their work and make additions, revisions and corrections.

Reading:

In Year 2 we use 'Bug Club' to teach reading. Children use the knowledge they have gained in their SPAG sessions to decode words alongside their teacher and peers. The stories we read span over a two-week period and throughout this time we focus on different VIPERs - vocabulary, inference, prediction, retrieval and sequence. As well as using role play and storytelling to promote a love of reading.

This week the children will focus on the Viper skill of inference looking at the Bug Club text 'the speediest sloth'.

This daily shared reading approach has replaced the 1:1 reads. We will use this knowledge combined with phonics assessments and half termly 1:1 reads to inform our tracking of progression in reading and the children will still progress through the phases.

Fluency:

This week, we will look at a poem called 'The Sound Collector'.

Please continue to read at home and upload your comments onto the 'BoomReader' app.

SPAG

Learning in school:

Children will be reviewing Phase 5 phonemes, graphemes and tricky words. They will practise reading, writing and spelling using these graphemes.

Topic

Learning in school:

History: This week we will compare and contrast Ibn Battuta's experiences with those of other explorers.

RE: Children will be learning about Islam. Children will think about the important question - how can we tell if something is important for a Muslim family?

Science: Children will be learning about microhabitats and identifying and classifying minibeasts.

Art: Children will begin their new module called 'Craft and Design: Map it out'.

PSHE: Children will continue with the module 'Keeping myself safe.'

Music: Children will continue their music module for this half term, which is called 'Contrasting dynamics'.

Computing: Children will continue their computing module 'Presenting Ideas'.

PE: For this half term, the children will be doing Gymnastics.

Please could children wear their PE kit to school on their class's PE days.
