Maths

In Maths we will be learning to identify and represent numbers to 50 on a number line. We will be asking: 'Does a number line always start on 0?' and 'Can it be a number line if it counts in steps of 10?' The children will be learning to work out the half way point between any given start and end numbers and then we will move onto estimating a number between two given points.

English

In week 3 of our *I love Your Book- Here's Mine!* Project, the children will be authors and illustrators. They will use their story map from last week to put their ideas onto the page! The children have loved our VIPERS text 'the Night Gardener' by the Fan Brothers and we will continue to explore the text, focusing on: *inference* and *explain*.

Phonics and Reading

Our new graphemes will be: **a (or) water**, **a (o) want**, **grow the code: (air) ear, ere**
There will be no new tricky words this week. We will be revising the words: **who, whole, because, eye, people thought, through**

In line with British Science Week our fluency text is an AI speech called: Dreaming Big: I want to be a Scientist!

Topic

Next week is Science Week. In addition to our weekly science lesson where we will be learning about garden and wild plants, we will also be: smashing stereotypes, learning about STEM jobs, using our close observations skills, discussing scientific questions and sharing books with a science theme.

History- In history we will be exploring the question: Did everyone live like Queen Victoria? We will be learning about rich and poor life in the Victorian era.

PSHE- We will be thinking about the importance of taking care of things.

Art- We will be cutting and folding paper to make a 3D forms.

RE- We will be exploring stories Jesus told and looking at what Christians learn from his stories.

Music- We will be creating rhythmic patterns with instruments by identifying the syllables in given words and phrases.
