Maths

Learning in school:

In maths, children will begin learning about:

- > Doubling and halving
- > Odd and Even numbers
- > Divide by 5
- > Divide by 10

English, Reading & Fluency

Learning in school:

In English, children will be looking at the key features of a non-fiction text. Children will then plan what they would like to write their non-fiction text about. Children will then look at the 4 different sentence types and how they can use these in their plans. Towards the end of the week, children will start their non-fiction piece of writing.

Reading:

In Year 2 we use 'Bug Club' to teach reading. Children use the knowledge they have gained in their SPAG sessions to decode words alongside their teacher and peers. The stories we read span over a two-week period and throughout this time we focus on different VIPERs - vocabulary, inference, prediction, retrieval and sequence. As well as using role play and storytelling to promote a love of reading.

This week the children will focus on the Viper to Explain.

This daily shared reading approach has replaced the 1:1 reads. We will use this knowledge combined with phonics assessments and half termly 1:1 reads to inform our tracking of progression in reading and the children will still progress through the phases.

Fluency:

This week, we will look at a poem called 'Upside Down'.

Please continue to read at home and upload your comments onto the 'BoomReader' app.

SPAG

Learning in school:

Children will be reviewing Phase 5 phonemes, graphemes and tricky words. They will practise reading, writing and spelling using these graphemes.

Topic

Learning in school:

Geography: Children will be learning about the hot and dry seasons in the Savannah and the effect this has on the migration of different African animals.

RE: Children will continue their learning about why Christians call Jesus the 'Saviour' and 'Rescuer'.

Science: Children will recognising the difference between things that are alive, were once alive or have never been alive.

Art: Children will continue their module called 'Craft and Design: Map it out'.

PSHE: Children will continue their new module 'Rights and Responsibilities'.'

Music: Children will continue their music module for this half term, which is called 'Singing: on this Island'.

Computing: Children will continue their computing module 'Effective Searching'.

PE: For this half term, the children will be doing Sending and Receiving.

Please look inside your child's homework book for this week's homework slip. Thank you.

The spelling pack that your child bought home before half term is to remain at home so that the children can practise the words as often as possible. This could be on plain paper, lined paper or on a whiteboard. Can you challenge your child to use some of the words in a sentence?
