PE and Sport Funding Plan Academic Year 2021 -2022

At The Mead Infant School and Nursery School, the PE and Sport Grant is used to improve and develop the teaching and learning of PE for everyone with an emphasis on the importance of a healthy lifestyle and the participation and enjoyment of sport both inside and outside of school hours. In the academic year 2021 – 2022 we will receive approximately £17 800 new sports funding from central Government. This additional funding will be used to extend sporting opportunities for all pupils at The Mead including those with profound Special Educational Needs in our Hearing Impaired Resource Base. £8 000 of the funding received in the academic years 2019-20 and 2020-21 has been carried forward to the 2021-22 academic year due to limitations to spending caused by the Coronavirus pandemic.
